

## Fleets Division Update

As the police fleet ages, the Village is replacing squads with modern, fuel efficient vehicles in an effort to be more fiscally responsible as well as lessen the carbon footprint.

Fleets Division is also preparing new equipment. Streets Division has acquired a new asphalt roller as well as a new end loader, replacing existing units which were in need of replacement.



Fire Hydrant Flushing
The Utilities Division will begin their fire hydrant flushing program in the early fall season. Customarily this has been undertaken in the spring and early summer months. Flushing in the fall season shall reduce the peak daily flows as the summer months demand higher volumes of water use due to lawn irrigation and other outdoor activities.

The Utilities Division is dedicated to providing the highest quality potable water as well as conserving this precious natural resource. The annual flushing of the water distribution system will remove stagnant water that is trapped within the water distribution system at various locations such as dead ends, cul-de-sacs and areas of the Village that do not have a high water

If you should have any questions regarding the flushing program or when you can expect the fire hydrants in your neighborhood to be flushed, please contact the Public Works Facility.

## **In-House Street Sweeping**

The In-House Street Sweeping program will be effective on a weekly basis for all Sweeping Zones starting Wednesday, October 1st through the month of November, weather permitting. The Village street sweeper will be aided

> by contracted supplemental sweepers to complete all zones each week.



There are color coded "No-Parking" signs erected in each zone to indicate the day that the parking restrictions are in effect. Please assist the Village in these operations and remove all vehicles from the roadway on the Sweeping Zones designated day of

the week between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. This will aid the Village in sweeping efficiently each of the zones.

- Use least toxic pesticides, follow labels, and learn how to prevent pest problems
- Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces; consider a rain garden to capture runoff
- Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway
- ♦ Check your car for leaks and recycle your motor oil
- Pick up after your pet
- Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected regularly

## October is Anti-Bullying Awareness Month

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose.

Bullying is the most common form of violence in schools (verbal and physical) with one incident of bullying happening every seven minutes. It is estimated that 160,000 children miss school everyday due to the fear of attack or intimidation by other students.

Bullying can affect everyone—those who are bullied, those who bully, and those who witness bullying.
Bullying is linked to many negative outcomes including impacts on mental health, substance use, and suicide. It is important to talk to kids about bullying

### Police Officer Test

The Glendale Heights Police Commission is currently looking to create an eligibility list for police officer positions and is accepting applications. Candidates must be a U.S. citizen or legal alien admitted for residence, have no felony convictions and possess a valid Driver's License. Eligibility requirements also include having an Associate's Degree, or 60 semester hours, or 90 quarter accredited college hours, or 2 years active military duty with an honorable discharge. Applicants must be 21-35 years of age or 20 years of age with 2 years law enforcement studies at the time of application, or as otherwise exempt from age limitations set forth by Statute. Qualified candidates must submit applications by the due date of Thursday, September 18th no later than 7:00 pm. ### School is Back in Session!

Remember that school is back in session. It is critical that we remain extra cautious and alert for children while driving through the community. This is also a perfect opportunity to review safety awareness with your children.

#### **DRIVERS:**

**SLOW DOWN!!!** Be **EXTRA ALERT** around parked cars, school crossings, anywhere children are present. USE CAUTION near bus stops. It is unlawful for a driver to pass a school bus that has stopped to load or unload children when its stop signal arm is extended. The driver is required to stop his or her vehicle before passing the school bus from either direction. An exception is when the driver is on a highway with four or more lanes with at least two lanes of traffic in either direction. If the driver is going in the opposite direction of the bus, they do not have to stop.

#### **PARENTS:**

Know your child's route to and from school, who they walk with and where they live. Review pedestrian rules and the importance of wearing a helmet when biking or skating with your children. Discuss "home alone" rules, what to do in an emergency and "stranger danger" in an age appropriate manner to ALL age groups!

#### **STUDENTS:**

Keep your regular routes to and from school, never walk alone, and always follow traffic signals and crossing guards. Cross streets where Crossing Guards are present when possible. Always use crosswalks, never walk between cars, and ALWAYS wear a helmet when biking or skating. Follow your parents "home alone" and after-school rules, know what to do in an emergency, and remember "stranger danger" guidelines apply to ALL AGES!

Buckle Up! Every Trip, Every Time!

Drive Now. Text Later. You can't do both!

Cell phone use while driving is illegal unless using a "handsfree" device.

## Fire Prevention Week October 5 - 11

This year National Fire Prevention Week runs from October 5th through the 11th. For the Glenside Fire District, the entire month of October is dedicated to public fire prevention awareness in our community. Throughout October, Glenside Firefighters will be visiting schools, hosting station tours and meeting with community and civic groups to promote fire safety. **What is carbon monoxide?** Carbon monoxide, or CO, is an odorless, colorless gas that can cause sudden illness or death.

What are the symptoms of CO poisoning? The most common symptoms of CO poisoning are headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, chest pain and confusion. High levels of CO inhalation can cause loss of consciousness and death. Unless suspected, CO poisoning can be difficult to diagnose because the symptoms mimic other illnesses. People who are sleeping or intoxicated can die from CO poisoning before ever experiencing symptoms.

**How can you prevent CO poisoning?** Have your heating system, water heater and any other gas, oil or coal burning appliances serviced by a qualified technician every year. Install a battery-oper-

ated or battery back-up CO detector in your home and check or replace the battery when you change the time on your clocks each spring and fall. If you believe there is CO poisoning in your home, dial 9-1-1 for ALL CO detector activations – do not contact the fire district! The 9-1-1 dispatcher will route your emergency!
