

Snowfall Parking Regulations

- No parking on any Village street designated as a snow route for 24 hours after a snowfall of 1" or more
- No parking on any Village street for 24 hours after a snowfall of 2" or more
- No parking on any Village street for 72 hours after a snowfall of 5" or more

Senior Citizen Utility Tax Rebate Program

Since 1995 the Senior Citizen Utility Tax Rebate Program has been available to assist hundreds of qualifying Seniors. This program provides a flat \$75 rebate of Municipal Utility Taxes paid in 2014 for electric, natural gas, telephone or cell phone bills. In order to qualify for a Utility rebate, participants must be age 65 or older on or before December 31, 2014, or have a spouse who is 65; been a resident of the Village of Glendale Heights (owner or renter) all of 2014; have a qualifying income of no more than \$40,000 as evidenced by your 2014 US Income Tax Return or other suitable documentation; and be able to show proof that (continued on p. 3)

Senior Citizen Utility Tax Rebate Program

(Continued from Page 1) the utilities are billed in your name. To apply, you can pick up an application at the Center for Senior Citizens or Village Hall, or if you would prefer, an application can be mailed to your residence. Applications are also available on the Village website.

Required Documentation:

- Completed & Signed Application
 Form Applications must be submitted no later than April 30, 2015.
- Proof of the following: age, residency, income and payment of utilities.
- Acceptable evidence for proof of age includes: Driver's License, Birth Certificate, Senior Identification card, Medicare card, or other acceptable forms of ID.
- Acceptable evidence for proof of residency includes: current tax bill, lease or rental agreement for the address for which reimbursement is requested.
- Name must be the same as rebate application and ID.
- Acceptable evidence for proof of income includes: 2014 Federal Income Tax Return (Form 1040 or 1040A), 2014 Form SSA-1099 Social Security Benefit Statement, 2014 Illinois State Income Tax Return.
- A recent utility bill is required to obtain a rebate.

If you have any questions, call the Center for Senior Citizens at 630.260.6050 or the Finance Department at 630.909.5342. Reimbursements will be made within 30 days following receipt of a completed and verified application.

Winter Reminder

The Glendale Heights Police Department is asking residents to please check on their relatives and friends to assure they are not in need of assistance due to the extreme weather conditions. Glendale Heights has warming shelters in place and is ready to assist the needs of our residents. The Village also offers CodeRED, a free service which to check on relatives and friends for you.

CodeRed allows the Police Department to communicate emergency situations, senior well-being checks, event reminders and other relevant information instantly via pre-recorded emergency telephone notifications to targeted areas or the entire Village at a rate of up to 60,000 calls per hour.

Water Rate Increase

On January 1, 2015 a water rate increase will be implemented for all customers in an amount of .71¢ per thousand gallons. The actual increase to the Village water bill will be reflected on the March 1, 2015 bill for the usage period of mid January to mid February. The new water rates affect customers based on the amount of water consumed and will increase the average residential customer's bill by \$5.33 per month. This change is a direct result of the actual cost of water purchased by the Village from the DuPage Water Commission.



How to Prevent Freezing Pipes

As the winter months approach it becomes important to remember to protect water and sewer systems that service the inside of your business or residence.

Freezing water pipes or drain pipes in a building are worse than inconvenient: often the frozen pipes burst, risking serious water damage and damage to your home. If you experience frozen or burst plumbing within your home or business, please call the Utilities Division at 630.260.6040.





Water Pollution Control Facility

The onset of cold weather necessitates a change in operations at the Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF). With slower biological activity, chlorine operations are no longer needed. Without chlorination activity at the Plant, there is no need to de-chlorinate. This provides WPCF staff with the opportunity to perform preventative maintenance to various systems over the winter season.

The staff at WPCF clean valves, seals, gaskets and pipelines to the chlorination/de-chlorination systems and perform preventative maintenance in preparation for the spring and summer operational seasons. In addition, each of the 600 filters of the tertiary disc filter system will be removed for cleaning and gasket replacement.

Village Engineering

The Engineering Division in Public Works provides engineering support to other divisions in the Village, as well as external professional services.

Over the winter, the Engineering Division is focused on reviewing permits and plans from various local utilities, private developers and capital projects for the Village in the upcoming year. This year the Engineering Division developed more detailed permitting guidelines for utility companies as well as creating engineering standards for private and public developments to streamline and expedite the permitting process.

Staff also upheld all local state and federal mandates, including storm water management compliance to new construction sites and ensured projects complied with Village Code.

Fleets Division

As the snow season continues, the Fleets Division will provide quality maintenance to ensure that our team has all of their equipment in the best possible condition to keep the streets of Glendale Heights clean and safe for our residents.

Fleets Division staff assemble and maintain all the snow fighting equipment to quickly and efficiently clear the streets of snow and ice. At the end of February, the division will begin preparing all equipment necessary for the spring and summer activities, such as road and park maintenance.



The snow season is upon us and the Public Works Department's 34 snow and ice control vehicles are prepared with snow removal equipment for the winter season.



Let's Keep our Kids Safe

As winter progresses, the Glendale Heights Police Department wants to remind drivers to drive with caution around schools during pick up and drop off times. Our children are our most important asset, and we want to keep them safe. In recognition of this, the Police Department conducts school safety zone enforcement throughout the Village. Our last campaign ended in November and resulted in 33 citations being issued for offenses including; disobeying a stop sign, being on a cell phone, not wearing a seat belt, not having children in child restraint systems and no insurance-all within the school zones during drop off and pick up times. The police department will continue to conduct this type of enforcement periodically during the school year. CERT Training to be held in April

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is a training program that prepares you to help yourself, your family and your neighbors in the event of a disaster. During an incident, emergency services personnel may not be able to reach everyone right

away. By getting trained as a CERT member, you will have the skills to help emergency responders save lives and protect property.

As a member of CERT, you will receive ongoing training and may be called upon in the event of a large-scale emergency or disaster that impacts the Village of Glendale Heights. Training topics include: fire safety, hazardous materials, terrorist incidents and search and rescue. All

equipment and course instruction is provided free of charge.

Tips for Driving in the Snow

Driving during winter weather conditions is sometimes hazardous at best. The Glendale Heights Police Department would like to provide the following tips to drivers during the winter months:

Maintain Traction—Start and stop gradually to avoid losing traction in wet or slippery conditions. Drive at steady speeds, avoid sudden starts or stops. Accelerate slightly when approaching a hill, and then maintain steady speed going up. Gearing down ahead of downgrades can help avoid brake wear and the chance of sliding.

Skids—Driving sensibly and steadily will avoid most skids. Anticipating turns or lane changes will help. If your vehicle begins to skid, remove your foot from the accelerator or brake and steer in the direction of the skid. When the vehicle steadies itself, turn the wheel straight and proceed.

Braking— Be gentle with braking pressure during slippery road conditions. Gentle pumping action on disc brakes will avoid locking the wheels and sending the vehicle into a skid or spin. Anti-lock braking systems provide this action for you. (DO NOT PUMP ANTI-LOCK BRAKES.) Avoid braking on curves by driving through them at a safe steady speed. Gear down for both uphill and downhill travel.

ADVICE FOR WINTER DRIVING

- SLOW DOWN in winter conditions
- Use headlights in bad weather
- Don't use cruise control in slippery conditions
- Remove ice and snow from windows, mirrors and vehicle lights
- Always wear your seatbelt
- Leave extra space between your vehicle and the one ahead of you
- · When possible, avoid driving in bad weather conditions

Sharps Disposal Program

The purpose of the sharps disposal program is to provide education and assistance to residents in the disposal of needles or "Sharps" in efforts to support the waste, recycling and green initiatives in DuPage County.

Sharps are objects or devices that have been used in patient care, medical, research or industrial laboratories. Sharps can be glass, metal or plastic with rigid corners, sharp edges or protruding pieces that can slice, scrape or pierce the skin. For the purpose of this program, we are referring to needles specifically.

Used needles should NOT be thrown in the garbage. Be sure you get rid of your used needles the safe way to avoid exposing other people to harm. The improper disposal of contaminated sharps is a serious safety concern for garbage collectors and landfill workers. We are offering these disposal tips as guidance, but please check with your doctor, clinic or hospital to see about a needle or "sharps" disposal that they may offer as well at their office.

Supervised Drop Box Collection Program

The supervised container collection site program is designed to allow residents of the Glenside Fire Protection District to drop off their sharps container during business hours of the Glenside Fire District.

- Sharps must be brought to the fire station in approved containers
- Sharps containers will only be accepted during business hours, Mon-Fri 8:00 AM-4:30 PM
- There is no fee for residents of the Glenside Fire District
