- Set your thermostat 10-15 degrees lower at night and when away from home during the winter to save up to 10% on energy costs

Volunteer Initiative Program (VIP)



Village Fleets Prep For Winter

The Fleets Division has prepared the snow and ice equipment for the winter season. Plows and salting equipment have been installed and tested. The Fleets Division takes great pride in assuring all snow removal equipment is ready to perform the task of keeping the streets and walkways free of snow and ice. It is the goal of the Fleets Division to calibrate each truck to put down enough salt to melt snow and ice, but not overly salt in order to preserve the environment. Please remember to keep a safe distance between you and the snow removal equipment. Plow trucks are considered emergency equipment and have the right of way on our roads.



Village Engineering

This year, the Village completed two major road projects overseen by the Engineering Division. The 2015 Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) Road Program reconstructed and repaired roads in the Village on various streets. In addition, the MFT Road Program includes the replacement of sidewalk, curb and driveway aprons.

The other major road project was a reconstruction of Darlene Lane and Pleasant Avenue, with the total replacement of the curb, driveway aprons, and sidewalk in need of repair. As part of this project, Lynn Court also received upgraded street lighting.

Staff will spend the winter months working on Engineering projects for the spring and selecting roads for next year's road program. They also upheld all local, state and federal mandates, including storm water management compliance on new construction sites and ensured projects complied with Village Code.

Water Pollution Control Facility

The Village recently entered into an agreement with the IEPA and DuPage River Salt Creek Work Group to help mitigate the effects of Phosphorus discharged to receiving streams. This agreement consists of stream modifications that help reduce the impact of Phosphorus discharges and improve aquatic life and naturalize the stream corridor. Projects are scheduled for the East and West Branch of the DuPage River as well as Salt Creek. The projects are to be completed by 2023.

Utilities Division

The Utilities Division has been successful in the completion of a major capital project over this construction season. This was the installation of new water main, fire hydrants, isolation valves and service valves on Pleasant and Darlene Lanes. This new water main and appurtenances were a part of this year's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).

Additionally, a second capital project will be undertaken over the coming months to the sanitary sewer lift station located at 521 North Avenue. This project will involve the installation of submersible pumps and is designed to better serve the Village. Improvements at this facility will help reduce energy costs, reduce confined space entries for Village staff and reduce maintenance costs.

In-House Street Sweeping to Continue through November

The in-house Street Sweeping has commenced on a weekly basis for all sweeping zones. The program began on October 2, 2015 and will continue through the month of November, weather permitting. In order to collect the volume of fall leaves the Village street sweeper is supplemented by contracted sweepers.

There are color coded no-parking signs erected in each zone to indicate the day of the week that parking restrictions are in effect. Please assist us and remove all vehicles from the roadway on the designated day of the week between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. This will aid in the efficient sweeping of each zone.

The Street Division has prepared the fleet of snow and ice fighting equipment for the Winter season.

Winter Parking

The Glendale Heights Police Department would like to remind residents of a few parking regulations within the Village.

Parking on Sidewalks

Within any sidewalk area, residents may park on an owner's driveway or across the sidewalk between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or within 24 hours after a snowfall of 1 inch or more has occurred from November 1st through March 31st.

Snowfall Parking

- There is no parking allowed on Village streets designated as a snow route for 24 hours after a snowfall of 1" or more
- There is no parking allowed on any Village street for 24 hours after a snowfall of 2" or more
- There is no parking allowed on any Village street for 72 hours after a snowfall of 5" or more.

Project Blue Light

Project Blue Light is a simple gesture. The color blue is symbolic of peace. The Village of Glendale Heights is asking residents to consider decorating at least one piece of your landscape or one window with blue lights during the holiday season. By displaying your blue lights, you will be sending a dual message: that you support America's peacemakers and that you hope the coming year will be a year of peace.

Project Blue Light began during the holiday season in 1988 when Mrs. Dolly Craig of Philadelphia, PA wrote to Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.) that she would be putting two blue candles in her living room that holiday season. One for her son-in-law, Daniel Gleason, who had been killed in the line of duty on June 5, 1986, while serving the Philadelphia Police Department, and the other for her daughter, Danny's wife, Pam, who was killed in an automobile accident in August 1988. Danny and Pam had six children. COPS adopted this idea as a way that everyone could honor the officers who serve and protect us while remembering those who have been killed in the line of duty. Project Blue Light now burns bright in the hearts of many of the nearly 15,000 surviving families of America's fallen law enforcement officers during the holiday season and throughout the year.

Since Project Blue Light was introduced, it has been embraced by many law enforcement organizations and their families. Please show your support for law enforcement officers who serve and protect every day of the year with a blue light this holiday season.

Holiday Safety Tips:

As the holiday shopping season is upon us, please take time to ensure you have a safe and happy holiday season. As you find time to shop, please be mindful of the following safety tips:

- Be aware of your surroundings. Look for suspicious persons, etc. when you are in any area.
- If shopping late in the day or after dark, park in an area that is well lit.
- Don't leave cell phones, purses, or any other item of value in your parked car where they can be seen. Always conceal these items.

Keep the Wreath Red

Each year during the holiday season, the Glenside and Bloomingdale Fire Protection Districts participate in the statewide "Keep the Wreath Red" program. The program starts when the Fire District illuminates a Christmas wreath with all red bulbs on the fire station. During the holiday season, if there are any fires related to decorations, a white bulb will replace a red bulb on the wreath. We ask everyone in the community to help "Keep the Wreath Red" by keeping some important safety tips in mind this holiday season.

- If you use a live tree, be sure to choose a fresh tree that is not shedding needles and keep it well watered.
- Make sure Christmas and Hanukkah lights are labeled by a testing laboratory. Replace any worn sets or those with loose connections. Outside, use lights labeled for outdoor lighting. Always unplug everything before going to bed or leaving home.
- Do not use candles in decorations or displays. Keep them away from curtains or other combustible materials and never put them in windows or near exits. Keep candles out of the reach of small children.

Fake IRS Scammers

Tax season may be over, but scammers posing as IRS officials continue to call, saying people owe taxes and better pay up. They threaten to arrest or deport people, revoke a license, or even shut down a business. How do they do it? By rigging caller ID information to appear as if the IRS is calling, and sometimes even making a follow-up call claiming to be the police. Glendale Heights Residents have recently received calls from 804.916.8700, which is a scammer attempting to gain your personal information.

To protect yourself from imposters who call, claiming to be from the IRS:

- Don't provide any account or other personal information. Hang up the phone.
- Never wire money or credit card information to a person or company you don't know. Once you provide the information, you can't get the money back.
- If you owe or think you owe federal taxes, call the IRS at 800.829.1040. IRS workers can help you with your payment questions. You also can visit the IRS web-site at www.irs.gov.
- If you've already paid your taxes, call and report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Information TIGTA at 800.366.4484.
- Forward emails from the IRS to phish-ing@irs.gov.
- File a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission at www.ftc.gov/complaint.

Lock it or Lose it

With the cold temperatures approaching, some residents find it convenient to go out and start their vehicles to allow them to warm up, or they leave their vehicles running while they run into the convenience store for that cup of coffee. No one likes to get into a cold car. However, most vehicle thefts are crimes of opportunity, so don't make it easier for thieves to steal cars. If you must warm up your vehicle, stay with your vehicle. If you are out running errands and run into a store or business, please shut your vehicle off and lock it. Remember it is illegal to leave your vehicle running and unattended.

Yard Waste Collections

Important Water Meter Notice

As the water meter installed in your home ages, the battery providing the necessary power to signal your usage is reaching its end of use. This makes it difficult to get an accurate read on the meter and in turn, creates an estimated read.

When the Village identifies your bill as estimated, a notice is mailed to your home requesting you to schedule an appointment for your meter to be serviced. To determine if it is an estimate, look at the amount listed for your "Current Read" on your water bill. If an "E" is displayed next to the number, your water bill is being estimated.

Example:

Meter No.	14029999
Current Read	283 E
Previous Read	281
Consumption	

This is an indication a problem with your water meter has occurred and service is required. To avoid errors in the amount billed to your account, it is important you contact Water Billing at 630.260.6010 to schedule a free meter service call.
