Bring your used cooking oil in a milk jug, 5-gallon bucket, or the container you bought it in. Cooking oil will be recycled for free by Green Grease Environmental and turned into bio-fuel. Pouring your used cooking oil down drains can cause it to stick to sewer pipe causing clogs and breaks that are costly for homeowners and the Village to fix.

Recycle your old shoes at the Sports Hub in the designated Shoe Recycling Bin. Just like paper, plastic, and glass, shoes can be reused and recycled into a variety of new products. Approximately 300 million pairs of shoes are put into landfills every year and each shoe takes at least 50 years to break down. Footwear of all kinds and conditions are accepted. Shoes should be bagged and tied together.
