

Congratulations Chief Douglas Flint



Flag Day

Tuesday, June 14



Flag Day is celebrated on June 14th. In honor of our "Red, White and Blue," the following tips for proudly displaying our U.S. flag are recommended by the National Flag Day Foundation:

- Hoist the flag briskly, and lower it ceremoniously.
- If you display the flag overnight, illuminate it.
- No other flag or pennant should be placed above or at the same level to the right of the U.S. flag.
- Don't allow the flag to touch anything beneath it, including the ground, water or the floor.
- When your flag fades or wears thin (typically after a year) replace it with a new one.
- Remember to dispose of the old flag in the Village's Flag Depository (located at the circular island in front of Village Hall) for proper military disposal.

The Flag Disposal Program was started in 2004 by Village Trustee Chester Pojack. As of March 30, 2016, a total of 5,580 flags have been collected. For information concerning the Flag Disposal Program, contact Village Trustee Chester Pojack at 630.909.5310.

Emerald Ash Borer

The Village of Glendale Heights has aggressively removed Ash trees in the parkways, parks and on public property. The Village is asking residents to inspect their ash trees to determine if they have been infested. If your Ash tree is not yet dead or diseased, we request that you monitor it closely. Signs of Emerald Ash Borer infestation include:

- Branches at the top of the crown beginning to die
- "Suckers" of new young branches beginning to sprout from the trunk and base of the tree
- Vertical splitting of the tree bark
- Damage from woodpeckers that feed on the Emerald Ash Borer

If your tree is infested, it must be removed. The Village will work with residents to give adequate time to remove an infested tree, but must consider the safety of the public and property. Dead trees will begin to drop limbs or fall in heavy winds, and may cause injury or property damage. We also request that you consider removing your Ash tree when it begins to show signs of infestation rather than wait until it becomes a safety hazard.

Step inside the front door and step back in time to the way things were 100 years ago, right down to the working pump on the kitchen sink, a wood burning stove in the kitchen, oil burning light fixtures and the player piano in the front parlor. The attached exhibit hall is devoted to the display of the history of Glendale Heights, from the original settlers who arrived in the 1830's, to the incorporation of the Village in 1959, and its growth and development over the past 50 plus years.

If you love the Victorian era, this is something you will want to experience. Bring the kids along to see the working train set and farm land exhibit and don't forget your camera. The Historic House is a wonderful "old place" in our community for everyone to enjoy!



Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF)

On February 23rd, Chuck Fonte, WPCF Manager, and Ted Sorensen, WPCF Lead Operator, were invited to discuss the waste water treatment process with the 6th grade class at Marquardt Middle School. The lecture included a presentation describing how particles and bacteria are removed from waste water and how sludge can be used as fertilizer. Influent, effluent and sludge from the treatment facility was also on hand for the students to view. The presentation was a huge success and we hope to make it an annual event.




Water Conservation

Please remember that water conservation measures will be implemented during the summer months. The following restrictions apply from May 1st through September 30th.

1. Use On Odd Numbered Days: Homeowners/business owners with an odd numbered street address may engage in outdoor water use on odd numbered calendar days between the hours of 6:00 am and 10:00 am, and between the hours of 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm.
2. Use On Even Numbered Days: Homeowners/Business Owners with an even numbered address may engage in outdoor water use on even numbered calendar days between the hours of 6:00 am and 10:00 am, and between the hours of 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm.

Uses Permitted On All Days: Outdoor usage of water will be allowed during all hours on all days, provided that hoses are used for outdoor water usage which are fitted with automatic shutoff devices.



Village Engineering

The Division is currently focused on the summer construction period. In part, this involves performing detailed engineering reviews on incoming building applications from private businesses, citizens, and for Village projects.

Summer is here and with it some major road construction projects. This summer East Fullerton Avenue will be reconstructed from Glen Ellyn Road to Liberty Drive. This project will be partially funded as part of a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) project, administered by DuPage County.

Staff also upheld all local, state and federal mandates, including storm water management compliance to new construction sites and ensured projects complied with the Village Code.


Village Fleets

The Fleets Division has completed the recommission process for all equipment used to maintain the Village's parks and fields. After a relatively mild winter, Fleets has removed the snow and ice equipment from vehicles and equipment. The Streets Division Fleet is being prepped to perform warm weather duties such as sidewalk repairs and pavement upgrades throughout the Village."

The Fleets Division would like to remind residents to prepare their own vehicles for the warmer days ahead. Checking tire condition and inflation, and having the air conditioning systems inspected can be beneficial to preparing your car for the warmer weather. A little preventative maintenance now will save you from untimely breakdowns on the road.

The Village of Glendale Heights Police Department, the Glenside Public Library District and the Glendale Heights Sports Hub is hosting "Jump Into Character!" Bloomington Fire Protection District Receives High Marks in PPC Rating



The Bloomington Fire Protection District #1 was recently evaluated by the Insurance Services Office (ISO). The ISO's staff collects information from over 48,000 municipal fire protection agencies in communities throughout the United States, analyzes relevant data and assigns a Public Protection Classification (PPC) — a number from 1 to 10 (1 is the highest). A community's Public Protection Classification is based on the three main areas of a community's fire protection capabilities: emergency communications, fire department operational considerations, and water supply. In addition, it includes a community risk reduction section that recognizes community efforts to reduce losses through fire prevention, public fire safety education, and fire investigation. Many insurance companies use this information to help determine their customer's property insurance premiums.

Since 2003, the District had been rated as a PPC 3 in the Village and 9 in the rural areas.

On Friday, February 26th, 2016, the Bloomington Fire Protection District was awarded a Public Protection Class (PPC) score of 2. This places Bloomington in the top 2% of all fire departments in the United States for its ability to respond to emergencies.

The report from the ISO evaluation will be studied in detail to identify additional areas that may be improved.

The entire staff of the Bloomington Fire Protection District put forth an enormous amount of time and effort in making this evaluation a success and the Class 2 rating is a significant improvement and achievement.

Police Diversion Program

The Glendale Heights Police Department Diversion Program provides a positive alternative to formal court processing for first-time, misdemeanor, juvenile offenders.

The purpose of the Diversion Program is to provide youthful offenders with a positive alternative to the court system. Young offenders will participate in structured activities and group interactions which are intended to improve their understanding and perception of the legal system and law enforcement. The program will also increase their self-esteem, introduce better methods of communication and improve their decision-making skills. Through structured activities and community service, the program aims to reduce the "repeat offender" rate among these participants.

By providing this opportunity, youth are given the chance to maintain a clean record, while still being held accountable.





Taxpayers in Glendale Heights will soon see their 2015 property tax bills in the mail, as they were sent out on April 29 from the DuPage County Treasurer's office. Equalized assessed values within the Village, both in the Bloomingdale and Milton Townships, show continued declines from the prior year, although not nearly to the extent as during the peak of the housing market crash. There are many positive signs pointing to the fact that the worst of the real estate crisis is behind us, and overall, things have stabilized.

The Village is one of many taxing bodies that make up your total tax bill. On average, only about 10.9% of the taxes billed come back to the Village, while the remaining 89.1% go to all the other taxing districts, with Schools receiving the majority share of that (73.3%). The Village Board has worked very hard together to keep property tax levies at responsible levels, and despite declines in Equalized Assessed Values since 2008, the Village's total dollar tax levy for 2015 is the same as it was in 2014.



Village Vehicle Stickers

The 2016-17 Village vehicle stickers are sold at Village Hall at the Administrative Services counter beginning in May. The new vehicle sticker must be displayed by 12:01 am, July 1st, 2016 on the lower right hand corner of the windshield. Passenger vehicle stickers are \$15, motorcycle tags are \$12, recreational vehicle stickers are \$18, and trucks with B plates are \$25. There is an additional price schedule for trucks based on their individual weights. Qualifying senior citizens receive one sticker at no charge.

Per Village Ordinance, overnight parking on Village streets is restricted to those vehicles having a valid vehicle sticker.

Sticker Purchase: By Mail

If you bought one or more sticker(s) last year, the Village will mail you a pre-printed renewal application during the first week of May. If you receive a pre-printed renewal application, you'll be able to conveniently purchase your sticker either by mail or at Village Hall. If you have purchased a new vehicle with a new license plate, you must include a copy of your license plate registration with your renewal application.

If you have not received a pre-printed form with your vehicle information, you are required to provide proof of your State Vehicle Registration, or proof of address, showing your Glendale Heights address at time of purchase. Failure to provide proof of residency of a Village address will result in sticker costs to be doubled. Adequate proofs of residency include a driver's license, utility bill or lease. Exceptions are made for residents who bring home a business vehicle. Residents are required to bring a letter on company letterhead indicating to whom the vehicle is assigned with resident's home address.

Sticker Purchase: In Person

If you'd rather buy your new sticker(s) in person instead of by mail, or need to provide your proof of residency, you can do so at Village Hall during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, between 8:00 am and 4:30 pm, and Thursday evenings until 7:00 pm. For your convenience, Village Hall will be open on Saturdays in June from 9:00 am to noon.

Late Payment Penalty

- A \$10.00 penalty will be charged if application is received after the deadline date of June 30th.
- A \$20.00 penalty will be charged if application is received after the deadline date of July 31st.
- A \$30.00 penalty will be charged if application is received after the deadline date of August 31st.



It is strongly recommended to purchase your stickers early to avoid long lines and penalties.

Dog & Cat License/Tag

Animal license registration forms will be mailed with your vehicle sticker renewal application. If you are mailing your animal license registration form, please remember to include a copy of your rabies vaccination.

The Village of Glendale Heights requires that the owner of any dog or cat above the age of four months be licensed and wearing the license/tag at all times. The biggest benefit of registering your pet with the Village of Glendale Heights is the increased chance of being reunited with your dog or cat, should it become lost. Applying for the license also serves as a reminder to renew your pet's annual rabies vaccination.

The application can also be returned in person through the Administrative Services counter of the Village Hall. The license fee is \$5.00 and is valid for a one year period May 1st to April 30th.


