Winter Prep on Your Vehicle

Beginning in mid-September, the Fleets Division will be preparing vehicles and equipment for snow removal operations. By the end of October, the division will start the seasonal decommissioning and storage of the equipment used solely during the spring and summer season. It is always a good idea to perform some form of Winter preparation on your personal vehicles. The Village's Fleets Division recommends doing the following before the cold season arrives:

- **Consider having your engine oil and filter changed and vital fluids checked.** A good recommendation is to have the transmission oil changed every 50,000 miles along with the filter.
- **Make sure you have a winter blend of windshield washer fluid that will not freeze in cold weather.** Keep a bottle of windshield washer fluid in the trunk as well. With winter weather, you will consume more washer fluid. Be sure to have good winter wiper blades properly installed.
- **Have your battery and charging system inspected.** With colder weather, the electrical system will be less efficient.
- **Hope for the best and prepare for the worst.** Even the best prepared vehicles can break down and being prepared will keep you warm and safe until help arrives.



In-House Street Sweeping

The In-House Street Sweeping program begins on a weekly basis for all Sweeping Zones starting Monday, October 3rd through the month of November, weather permitting. The Village street sweeper will be aided by supplemental contracted sweepers to complete all zones each week.

There are color coded "No-Parking" signs erected in each zone to indicate the day that the parking restrictions are in effect. Please remove all vehicles from the roadway on the Sweeping Zones designated day of the week between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. This will aid the Village in efficiently street sweeping each of the zones. For more information on the Street Sweeping program, please visit www.glendaleheights.org.



Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Utilities Division will begin their fire hydrant flushing program in October. Customarily this has been undertaken in the spring and early summer months. Flushing in the fall season reduces the peak daily flows as the summer months demand higher volumes of water use due to lawn irrigation and other outdoor activities.

The Utilities Division is dedicated to providing the highest quality potable water as well as conserving this precious natural resource. The annual flushing of the water distribution system may remove stagnant water that is trapped within the water distribution system at various locations such as dead ends, cul-de-sacs and areas of the Village that do not have a high water usage. In addition to flushing the fire hydrants, Utilities staff also perform a thorough inspection of each fire hydrant. Any operations or maintenance issues noted are logged in a data base and corrected in a timely manner. This annual maintenance program ensures proper operating fire hydrants in times of emergencies.

Village Engineering Update

This year, the Village completed a major road project using a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). This road reconstruction uses, in part, grant money administered by DuPage County. This year the CDBG road project involved the reconstruction of Fullerton Avenue. This included replacement of curb, sidewalk and driveways in need of repair.

Staff also upheld all local, state and federal mandates, including storm water management compliance to new construction sites and ensured projects complied with Village Code.

The Glendale Heights Police Department will host their 19th Citizen's Police Academy. The program taught by officers from the Glendale Heights Police Department along with guest instructors from other agencies, is designed to give residents a realistic view of police work by providing instruction on various police topics.

A minimum enrollment of 10 students is required to hold the Academy, and the maximum class size will be limited to 24 students.

Enrollment is free. Citizens 18 years of age or older who live or work in Glendale Heights are invited to attend. *Note: Due to the nature of the course and curriculum, individuals with prior felony arrests or convictions will be declined.

Applications can also be downloaded and printed from the Village website, but must be dropped off or mailed to the Police Department once completed.



Glendale Heights Police Department Testing

The Glendale Heights Police Commission is currently looking to create an eligibility list for police officer positions, and is accepting applications.

Candidates must be a U.S. citizen or legal alien admitted for residence, have no felony convictions and possess a valid Driver's License. Eligibility requirements also include having an Associate's Degree, 60 semester hours, 90 quarter accredited college hours, or 2 years active military duty with an honorable discharge. Applicants must be 21-35 years of age, or 20 years of age with 2 years law enforcement studies at the time of application, or as otherwise exempt from age limitations set forth by Statute.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Halloween is one of the most anticipated nights of the year for kids, but Safe Kids recently discovered some scary statistics with a first-of-its kind study on Halloween safety.

Only **1/3 OF PARENTS** talk to their kids annually about Halloween, although 3/4 report having Halloween safety fears.



On average, **TWICE AS MANY CHILD PEDESTRIANS** are killed while walking on Halloween compared to other days of the year.



Only **18%** of parents use reflective tape on their children's Halloween costumes.

The Do's and Don'ts of Republic Services Refuse and Recycling Collection Carts

DO:

- Place all refuse and recyclables in the appropriate collection cart provided by Republic Services. If you do fill your provided cart, you may use an approved container for the additional items.
- Keep the lid closed
- Place the cart as close as possible to the curb on collection day with the wheels facing toward the house and return it to the house when empty
- Leave approximately 2 feet between each cart and any other obstruction
- Notify Republic Services if your cart is damaged or stolen or if you have any questions at 847. 981.0091

DON'T:

- Put hazardous waste, paint cans, etc., in the cart
- Put hot ashes in the cart
- Paint or write on the cart
- Remove the cart from your residence

Village Code (cart storage):

Refuse and recycling carts may be placed out after 6:00 pm the day before the scheduled pickup, and must be removed no later than 12:00 am (midnight) on the day of collection. On non-collection days, refuse and recycling carts must be stored out of the view from the street. Village Code prohibits containers to be stored in the front yard, including the area between the building and front yard, or stored in the corner-side or side yard of any property including that area between the building and that yard unless screened from view from the street.


