Bomb Threat To School

Glendale Heights, IL – On Thursday October 1st, at 7:40AM Glendale Heights Police Department received a report of a bomb threat at Americana School, 1629 President Street. At the time of the reported threat school was not in session, All teachers and students upon their arrival were removed to an offsite location. Queen Bee School District 16 has contacted all parents of students and notified parents they may pick up their students at the offsite location, noted in the automated message. All students who have not been picked up will remain with their teachers and principle at Glenside Middle School. Students will be dismissed at their normal schedule.

The Glendale Heights Police Department is working in cooperation with Queen Bee School District 16, Glenside Fire Department, and the DuPage County Bomb Squad to inspect the building and return students and faculty to the school as quickly as possible.
