Executive Order 2020-5

**EXECUTIVE ORDER IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19
(COVID-19 EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 5)**

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2020, the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services declared that the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19” or the “Virus”) is a public health emergency of international concern; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national emergency beginning March 1, 2020, in an effort to contain and mitigate the national impact of the expanding global outbreak of the Virus and has activated emergency plans for the protection of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, JB Pritzker, Governor of Illinois, declared all counties in the State of Illinois as a disaster area on March 9, 2020 (Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation) in response to the outbreak of COVID-19 and again declared all counties in the State of Illinois as a disaster area on April 1, 2020 (the Second Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation, and, together with the First Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation, the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamations) in response to the exponential spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, I proclaimed a Disaster in the Village of Glendale Heights on March 17, 2020 and Declared an Emergency on March 23, 2020 pursuant to Village Ordinance 2020-14 in response to the COVID-19 outbreak; and

WHEREAS, JB Pritzker, Governor of Illinois, has issued Gubernatorial Executive Order Number 2020-18, extending the provisions of Executive Order Number 10 which orders all citizens of the State to “Stay at Home”, through April 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 has resulted in significant economic impact, including loss of income for businesses and wages for individuals and families, that undermine financial security and stability; and

WHEREAS, the Governor’s “Stay at Home” order and the COVID-19 pandemic has interrupted the transportation and supply chain for businesses throughout the community; and

WHEREAS, the “Stay at Home” effectively closed most sit-down liquor establishments and bars for an extended period of time; and

WHEREAS, the inability of restaurants to allow dine-in eating has severely impacted their ability to attract customers to their ability to carry-out or


THEREFORE, by the powers vested in me as the Village President of the Village of Glendale Heights, Illinois, and pursuant to the Illinois Management Agency Act 20 ILCS 3305, and the Village of Glendale Heights Ordinance No. 2020-14, Ordinance No. 2020-22 and Ordinance Number 2020-30, I hereby order the following, effective April 17, 2020, and for the remainder of the duration of the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation and Executive Orders, which currently extend through April 30, 2020:

Section 1: Section 11-6-10A1 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Glendale Heights as it pertains to the permit requirements for temporary signs and number of days a temporary sign can be displayed is hereby suspended until such time as restaurants and bars are allowed to offer a dine-in option for their patrons.

Section 2: The length of time that a liquor establishment has been closed due to the Governor’s Executive Order closing bars and restaurants shall not count towards the 30 days of cessation of business which creates a forfeiture of a liquor license as provided by section 4-3-34 of the Municipal Ordinances of the Village of Glendale Heights.

Section 3: Section 5-6-5C of the Municipal Code of the Village of Glendale Heights as it pertains to Loading and Unloading during specific hours is hereby suspended for the duration of this Emergency.

Section 4: If any provision of the Executive Order or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, this invalidity does not affect any other provision or application of this Executive Order, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application. To achieve this purpose, the provisions of this Executive Order are declared to be severable.
