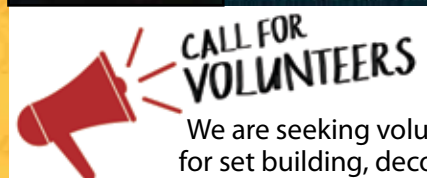
HAUNTED TRAIL: THE RETURN

An identification card can be obtained for \$20; however, if you are age 65 or older you may obtain a free, non-expiring State of Illinois photo ID card.

Drivers age 75 or older are required to take a driving test to renew their driver's licenses; therefore they must visit a Secretary of State Driver Services facility.

Rules of the Road classroom session is from 10:00 am to 11:30 am. The class is free, but registration is required on or before October 1st.

The Mobile Driving Service is from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm. No registration is required and is open to all residents.

Keep Yard Waste Off the Streets

At this time of year, leaves are changing colors and falling to the ground. As leaves fall, they have a tendency to fall into your gutters and possibly clog them up. Keeping your gutters and downspouts clear of leaf debris is an important way to get water away from your roof and the foundation of your home.

The curbs and gutters of the streets of Glendale Heights can be clogged just like the gutters of your house. Clogged gutters can lead to street flooding with our typical fall rains. That's one of many good reasons to properly collect and dispose of your fall waste, and to not let them blow into the streets. Another reason is that leaves that go into the road drains go directly into rivers where the nutrients in leaves will feed unwanted algae growth next summer. This algae decomposes at the bottom of lakes and uses up oxygen that fish and native plants need. So please help our rivers, creeks, and streams, and bag up those leaves!

Road Construction Program

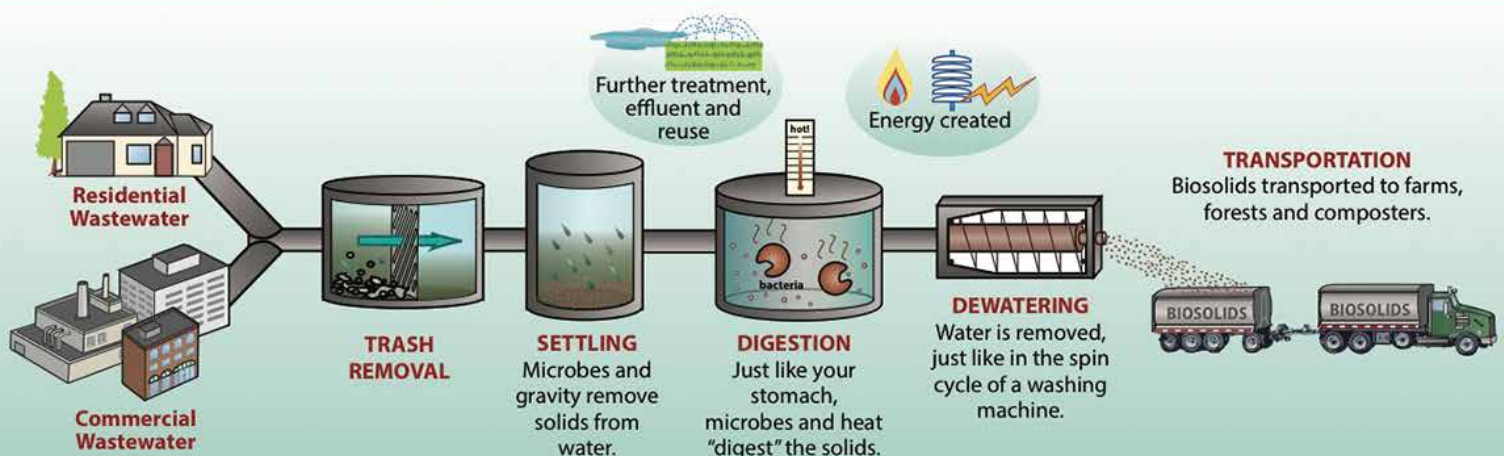
Eight streets are undergoing road construction that involves replacement of the aging asphalt of the road, and the repair of curb, sidewalk, and drainage systems. The construction includes the repair and replacement of Windy Point Drive from Paul Avenue to Bloomingdale Road, completing a road reconstruction project that began in 2014. This construction is partially funded by the Motor Fuel Tax funds generated by the state gas tax and REBUILD Illinois Bond funds.

In-House Street Sweeping

The In-House Street Sweeping program begins on a weekly basis for all Sweeping Zones starting October 1st through the month of November, weather permitting. There are color coded "No-Parking" signs in each zone to indicate the day that the parking restrictions are in effect. Please remove all vehicles from the roadway on the Sweeping Zones designated day of the week between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. This will aid the Village in efficiently street sweeping each of the zones. 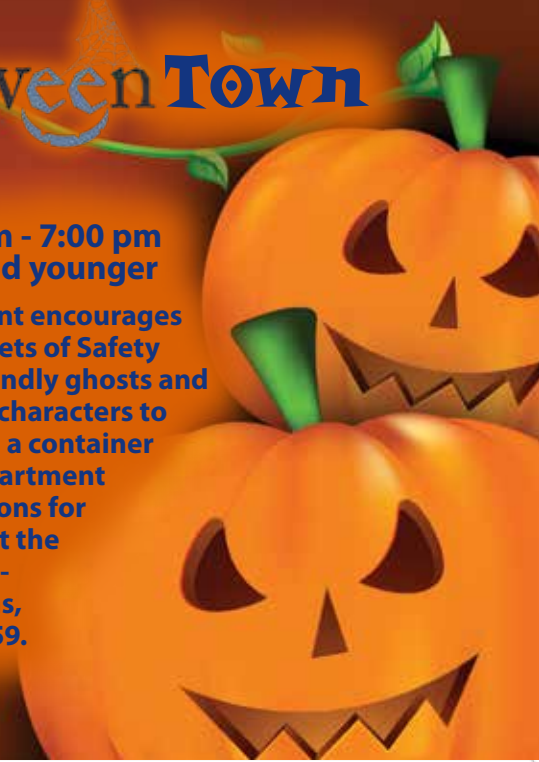

Smart911 is a free public safety service that helps first responders help you more quickly when you dial 911. You create an electronic safety profile that provides essential household information about family members, home, pets and vehicles. This information will display automatically on the 911-call taker's screen when you make an emergency call. It is private and secure, and you control what information is in your profile. Smart911 is offered by the Emergency Telephone System Board of DuPage County and is supported by existing 911 fees.
