One Charged with Burglary

Glendale Heights, IL – On 11/16/2016 at 12:38 AM officers from the Glendale Heights Police Department responded to the 100 block of Stonefield Drive for a report of a suspicious subject reported to be looking into vehicles. Responding officers observed a male subject inside a vehicle parked on the street. The subject fled on police arrival and was subsequently captured after a short foot pursuit with the assistance of the Glendale Heights Police Department canine unit. The suspect was identified as Jonathon Pfeifer, 31 years of age, of Glendale Heights.

Pfeifer was charged with two counts of burglary and one count of possession of a controlled substance, and transported to DuPage County Jail to await a bond hearing.
