Glendale Heights Police Department seeking assistance with a Bank Robbery

Glendale Heights, IL – On Wednesday, March 14, 2018 at approximately 9:00 am, the Glendale Height Police Department responded to the TCF Bank, located at 2164 Bloomingdale Road for a report of a bank robbery. Employees reported that a man entered the business through the front door and approached a teller and demanded money. After receiving an undisclosed amount of cash, the man exited the business through the front door and was last seen fleeing the area north on a bicycle. No weapon was displayed and no injuries were reported as a result of this incident.

The Glendale Heights Police is seeking assistance with identifying the offender of this bank robbery. Witness descriptions describe him as a male white, approximately 5'9 to 6'0, medium build, approximately 40 years of age. He was wearing a grey/ green hooded sweatshirt or jacket (with pattern) with black trim, blue jeans, and dark colored gym shoes with white soles. This offender appears to be the same offender who committed a robbery at the Schaumburg TCF bank on March 6, 2018.

This matter continues to be investigated jointly by Glendale Heights Police Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
